I have been informed that a school crossing near to St. John's school has been planned not to be replaced.

The location is: Newcastle Lane / Harpfield Rd Trent Vale

We think this is the roundabout between St. John's and Thistley Hough High school.

The school crossing patrol position has been vacant for at least 12 months.

The saving to the Local authority to not replace this crossing patrol is £7,750.

The Local authority say there are no records of collisions at school time or involving a child casualty during this time.
