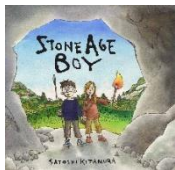
Enclosed in this letter is an overview of all the exciting learning your child will be completing this half term. As you can see, we're going to be very busy!

## English



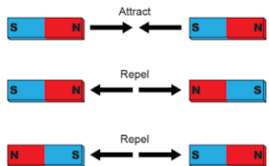
Our book for this term is 'Stone Age Boy.' We will be looking at our previous topics of the Stone Age to help us write setting descriptions and look at the characters within the story. We will also be looking at poems which talk about memorable moments in history such as the Ice Age! The children will have the opportunity to write their own historical poem.

## Maths

In Maths we are completing our multiplication and division topics. We will then be moving onto length and perimeter and starting our fraction topic towards the end of this term.



## Science



Our topic in science this term is 'Forces and Magnets'. We will be looking at a range of magnets, their characteristics and the effects on different materials. We will also be looking at the forces 'push' and 'pull' and how these forces effect objects.

## RE



This half terms RE topic is, 'How and why people try to make the world a better place?' In this unit, pupils will find out about how Jewish, Christian, Muslim, and non-religious people try to care for the world. They will consider what motivates people from these worldviews to care for the world, basing their knowledge on scripture and religious teachings.

## PSHE

During this term the children will be looking at the topic of 'Dreams and Goals.' They will get to discuss their dreams of what they want to do when they are older and how it is important to keeping challenging themselves to achieve those goals.



## Geography

We are continuing to finish our Geography topic of 'Our Planet, Our World.' Later on in the term we will start our next topic in the 'Rocks, Relics and Rumbles' children will be looking at the properties of the Earth's four layers. They will be comparing and grouping rocks based on their appearance, properties and uses. The children will learn how fossils are formed, learn about how plate tectonics has changed the Earth's surface and explore volcanoes.



## PE



In PE our topics are gymnastics indoors and outdoor adventure outside. These will both offer a range of new skills and activities.

## Art

This term in Art, we are looking at a topic called 'Ammonite'. We will be looking at examples of Ammonites, which are coiled shells, exploring repeated patterns and developing artistic techniques used in sketching, printmaking and sculpture.



## French



Our French topic this half term is all about Fruit! We will be learning how to name 10 fruits in French, changing from singular to plural, as well as building sentences to say which fruit we like and don't like.

## Computing

In computing this half term, we are looking at 'Repetition in Shapes.' This involves using programming software to move things around.
