Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy New Year! A huge welcome to our new families that have started in Early Years this week.

We are incredibly lucky to have such a fun first week back with our Three Musketeers WOW week. Lots of new and unique activities such as French food tasting, fencing, a theatre trip and a Masquerade ball to finish on Friday!

The fun does not stop there either we are currently negotiating the cost of another trip this term and details will follow once our prices are secured.

Included in this Class Newsletter is an overview of all the learning that will be packed into this half term. Our Topic will be 'Winter Wonderlands' and 'Starry nights' where we learn about the seasonal changes during Winter and places in the world where it is Winter all the time. Added to this we will compare our own Winter nights with those in the Antarctic. Moving through the term we will

start to learn about Space, stars and planets such as the Earth and Moon. Part of our topic we will be learning about famous space travelers and what they have seen in our skies.

Lots of adventure and exploration as we reach for the stars!





Home Learning:

Activities will continue to be sent home termly. We ask that an attempt is made at 4 out of the 6 activities for the child to get a homework certificate at the end of each term.

Children only need to complete a maximum of one homework

task each week. Homework books to be given to Class teacher on Friday's they will be returned the same day.

Home Reading:

Most children have developed onto books with words during last half term. We are incredibly proud of the readers our children are becoming.

We are due to start our Phase 3 Phonics sessions this Spring 1 term. These are notoriously difficult sessions that require lots of practice.

We ask that children are read with 5 times a week, even just one page a day helps! Once you have read with your child we ask you leave a note in their diary's so we can work more collaboratively to ensure your child is getting the best support.



This term we flew kites, made recycled wind socks, did some huff and puff painting, drew around our shadows, hung out Miss Holland's washing, made bird (but probably squirrel) feeders, raced our trikes/bikes, threaded a trellis fence, cooked mud pie birthday cakes, dug in the sand pit, went on a bear hunt, built snowmen, had a snowball fight and a million other side quests along the way!

These will be continuing through this term and we can't wait to see what is in store.

We strongly encourage children to come dressed warmly on Monday as the they will be outside for the majority of the day. We also have our outdoor P.E session on this day so children can wear P.E. kits with a few other layers if needed.

If it is wet outside bring wellies and waterproofs as we love to run around in the rain and jump in puddles!

If it is cold children will need to wear hat, scarves and gloves. It helps us immensely if these are named and also means if they get lost we can usually unite them with their rightful owner.



Phonics:

Our wonderful children did a great job at securing their Phase 2 Phonics learning. This term we begin our journey into Phase 3, lots more digraphs and trigraphs to recall, lots more tricky words to learn to read and spell!

There will be a Phase 3 phonics meeting held on Friday 10th January 3.30-4.00pm where we go over phoneme pronunciation and some top tips in reading and writing using new phonics learning.

If parents would find it useful we will be offering for the first time a phonics workshop where parents can come into school to watch their children learn phonics in class. If you would like to take part in this please let Miss Holland know and she will arrange dates when interest is known.

English:

Learning this half term will be based around the story 'Let's all creep through crocodile creek.' By Jonny Lambert. During English session children will be encouraged to form letters correctly and spell words phonetically. We will be encouraging more children to write at greater length including short captions and sentences as a general expectations for the majority of pupils this term.

Most importantly this half term we will be encouraging children to start to read their own writing and giving support in checking what they have written makes sense.

Added to this as children start to learn more Phase 3 Phonemes we would hope to see these begin to emerge in their own writing too!

Mathematics:

We will continue on our Power Maths journey this term and children over the coming weeks will become familiar with counting representations (numerals, pictures, objects), cardinality (How many?) and abstract maths using numbers to 10 in fun and engaging ways.

We will also explore numbers within 10 (number bonds), comparing more/fewer than amounts, and combining two parts to make a whole amount (addition to 10).

In the last weeks of this term we will have sessions dedicated to measuring, children will learn how to measure length, height and weight, using the correct comparative terms and non-standard units to measure in.

PSHE:

This term we will focus on our own dreams and goals.

We will learn how determination and perseverance can help us to achieve.

We will look at how our actions and words can help others to succeed.

We will talk about how achieving our goals can make us feel proud.

RE:

In Religious Education, children will be learning about how families of different faiths welcome new babies.

We learn about how God loves all children through scripture in the Bible and about Christian Baptism ceremonies.

We will look at how the Muslim and Hindu faiths welcome new babies and how families show love for each other and their different God's.

Understanding of the World:

We will be carrying out lots of exploration of different parts of the world looking at the Antarctic where it has wintery weathers and snowy climates. We will be learning a little about the animals and people that live there and how their lives might be different to our own.

During our Science work we will be learning about Space and the Solar system, carrying out experiments in dark and light and launching our own rockets into the sky!

As part of our learning we will also look at the history of Space travel and the different people that have undertaken space adventures.

PE

PE lessons will take place on **Monday** and **Tuesday** this term.

We are asking that children come to school dressed in their PE kits on PE days. Please ensure your child is wearing no jewellery on these days.

Monday will be an outdoor P.E session to be included in our 'Muddy Monday' learning. This term children will be learning Ball skills such as throwing, catching, kicking and hitting.

Tuesday will be in the Hall and children will practise gymnastics with Miss Keogh from Time For Sport.
