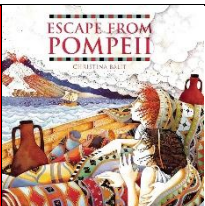
Enclosed in this letter is an overview of all the exciting learning your child will be completing this half term. As you can see, we're going to be very busy!

English



Our English lessons are based on a book called 'Escape from Pompeii' where we will be looking at the life of Romans, which links to our previous History lessons. We will be looking at skills based around poetry, paragraphs, noun phrases, developing sentences and building on many skills taught in our Autumn term.

Maths



This half term in Maths, we will be developing our skills surrounding Multiplication and Division and moving onto Length and Perimeter.

Science



Our Science topic this half term is 'States of Matter.' This will explore solids, liquids and gases. We look at the particle theory and investigate changes in states such as ice turning into water.

RE



This term in RE, Year 4 pupils will explore "What does it mean to be a Hindu in Britain today?" They will learn about key Hindu beliefs and practices, such as worship, festivals and family life, and how British Hindus express their faith in everyday life. The unit encourages understanding, empathy and respect for the diversity of beliefs and cultures within modern British society.

PSHCE



Changing Me

Our PSHE lessons will focus on the theme 'Changing Me'. We will explore the life cycle and discuss how we change as we grow. This includes looking at what we could do as babies compared to what we can do now, and considering how we will continue to change as we grow into adulthood.

Geography



This term we will continue our topic called 'Misty Mountain, Winding River'. Children will be looking at the physical processes of a river, sea or ocean and how they can change over time. They will be locating and exploring significant rivers and mountains around the world. Children will also be explaining ways that settlements, land use or water systems are used in the UK and around the world.

PE



In our PE lessons this half term, we will be focussing on Dance for a second half term and developing our skills from Autumn, as well as looking at Outdoor Adventure skills in our outdoor area.

Art



Our Art topic this half term is on Vista. We look at different landscape drawings and focus on mountain landscapes. We will explore using shading the outside landscapes and using our previous knowledge of colour theory to use colour to create a final mountain landscape piece.

French



In our French lessons this half term our focus will be 'Je peux.' In this unit pupils will learn 10 familiar activities that they are able or are not able to do in French. This is one of the first units introducing the negative form, allowing the children to build more interesting and complex sentences including the option of using conjunctions.

Computing



This unit teaches sequencing in programming using Scratch. Pupils learn how to use motion, sound, and event blocks to create simple programs. The unit ends with designing a piano project while building skills step by step.
