English	 <p>Our book this half term is 'The Last Wolf' by Mini Grey. We will be writing about real events. We will be improving our writing by making simple additions, revisions and corrections. The story is about Little Red setting off into the woods to catch a wolf . . . But the woods aren't all they seem - and are there even any wolves left?</p>
Mathematics	<p>During this half term, some of the topics in maths are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Multiplication and divisionHalves and quartersPosition and direction

Science	 <p>This topic teaches children about growth in animals by exploring the life cycles of some familiar animals. They build on learning about the survival of humans by identifying the basic needs of animals for survival, including food, water, air and shelter.</p>
RE	<p>This half term we will be covering, Who is Muslim and how do they live? This systematic study of Islam sets the foundations for pupils' learning about Muslims and the religion of Islam.</p>
PSHE	 <p>This half term we will be looking at the topic, Changing me. I can tell you some things about me that have changed and some things about me that have stayed the same. I know that changes are OK and that.</p>
History	 <p>This topic teaches children about the English and British monarchy from AD 871 to the present day. Using timelines, information about royal palaces, portraits and other historical sources, they build up an understanding of the monarchs and then research six of the most significant sovereigns.</p>
PE	 <p>This half term we will be looking at Boccia, which is a Paralympic target sport designed for athletes with significant physical impairments, similar to bowls. Played indoors while seated, propel red or blue leather balls as close as possible to a white target ball, called the "jack".</p>
Art	 <p>This topic teaches children about portraiture. They analyse the portraits of Tudor monarchs and compare Tudor portraits and selfies today. They use photo editing software to create royal portraits.</p>
Music	 <p>Music this term will be taught by The City Music School. We will be preparing for a performance later in the term.</p>
Computing	<p>Children will have an understanding of the various aspects of using a computer to create and change text. They will familiarise themselves with typing on a keyboard and begin using tools to change the look of their writing, and then they will consider the differences between using a computer and writing on paper to create text.</p>
